Wetland Mitigation Lease Agreement Amendment – Habitat Bank, LLC: City

Manager Taylor commented that the amendment would be to include the entire 240 acres transferred to the City by the DNR in 2002 into the mitigation bank. Discussion followed. <u>SUMMARY STATEMENT</u>:

The City Council approved funding for a civil engineer position in the 2015 budget. Staff is requesting consideration to hire this position at the senior engineer level. The civil engineer is classified as an M-14 with a pay range \$5,186 - \$6,309 per month. The senior engineer is an M-16 classification with a pay range of \$5,717 - \$6,956. The maximum difference between the two is 10% and the impact on the budget will be nominal.

If Council approves the change, staff will prepare a budget amendment that will be brought forward for Council consideration later in the year.

<u>RECOMMENDED ACTION</u>:

Authorize the hiring of a senior engineer in lieu of a civil engineer that was previously authorized for the 2015 budget.

<u>SUMMARY STATEMENT</u>:

A sinkhole developed on Mill Street between S. Pacific Avenue and S. 1st Avenue on Monday, January 5th. Public Works Operations initially investigated the sinkhole and it was determined the sewer line was broken. The decision was made to bring in a contractor with the necessary equipment to complete the investigation and effect any necessary repairs.

The contractor started work on Tuesday, January 6th and was completed on Tuesday, January 13th. Rotschy, Inc. replaced the broken concrete pipe with 16 feet of new PVC.

FINANCIAL SUMMARY:

The installed cost is not to exceed \$45,000.00 including sales tax.

<u>RECOMMENDED ACTION</u>:

Move to adopt this Resolution for emergency contract work performed on the Mill Street sewer line by Rotschy, Inc., without formal bidding.

RESOLUTION NO.

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF KELSO FINDING THE SEWER LINE REPAIR ON MILL STREET TO BE A SPECIFIC EMERGENCY AND APPROVES CONTRACT FOR EMERGENCY REPAIR WORK WITHOUT FORMAL BIDDING.

WHEREAS, the law at RCW 39.04.280 recognizes emergencies which may justify exemption from bidding requirements on public works projects upon subsequent findings of the existence of the emergency; and

WHEREAS, the City has a duty to maintain sewer lines in a safe manner to protect the public health, safety and welfare of its visitors; and

WHEREAS, the broken pipe had the potential to and did cause damage to personal property or life near the area which it stood; and

WHEREAS, as a result of the foregoing emergency, the City of Kelso entered into the

following contract in the absence of taking formal bids:

 "Rotschy, Inc." entered into a contract with the City of Kelso for all equipment, supplies, and supervision to repair and replace of approximately 30 lineal feet of concrete sewer pipe on Mill Street from S. Pacific Ave to S. 1st Ave.

NOW, THEREFORE,

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF KELSO DO RESOLVE AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Factual Findings in Support of Contract Award. The City Council finds the following:

 A collapsed sewer pipe running down the center of Mill Street between S. 1st Ave and S. Pacific Ave was creating safety and welfare concerns for the citizens of Kelso on or about the 5th day of January, 2015.

- 2. The collapsed pipe presented an immediate threat to property as well as the potential for bodily injury or loss of life if the road were to continue to collapse around the pipe.
- 3. City staff lacked the equipment and resources to immediately repair the sewer pipe.

Section 2. Existence of Emergency. The City Council finds that the conditions created by the hanging branch constituted an emergency that justified the waiver of the competitive bidding requirements and the immediate award of the contract to Rotschy, Inc., to address the emergency situation without formal public bidding.
